




2. The Organization of the courses in the programme in the semester system.






Majority of the alumni are of the opinion that the syllabus is a mixture of national and international perspective and it includes latest technological advances and current topics and research.


Majority of the alumni were satisfied with the e-resources pertaining to curriculum advancement and transmission at the institutuion while a few felt that it was below average.

5. The learning experiences of the legal education in terms of effective curriculum and transmission are:




With reference to the learning experiences of the legal education for effective curriculum transaction majority of the alumni termed the same as good while a few opined that it was average.


Majority of the alumni are of the view that the practical component in the syllabus needs a reconsideration while a few feel that there is no need to reconsider the same.


Majority of the alumni felt that the courses/subjects in the curriculum require a reexamination while a few are not in favour of it.




Majority of the alumni feel that the practical component in the syllabus has led to curriculum enrichment and its transmission while a few disagree with the same.





- 1) Mock trials like moot courts must be made a compulsory part of the practical curriculum to provide the students with the necessary training for examination and cross-examination of witnesses.
- 2) Observation of trial and internship must be made compulsory from the 1st and 3rd year of the 5 and 3 years LL.B course respectively.
- 3) The professors/lecturers must play an active role towards the development of the introverted students by creating a motivational environment. These students should be encouraged to participate in various extra curricular activities like quizzes, moots, debates, sports setc; and the professors/lecturers should provide active rather than passive guidance. This will contribute in the long run towards the personality development of the such students.
- 4) Jurisprudence and Interpretation of Statutes must be made compulsory courses for all students.

Needs improvement


The B.A. LL.B Programme has helped me to gain wider perspective in terms of the social needs which has helped me to enter into politics.

More optional subjects could have been added in the curriculum



The content of the courses and adequacy of the content is good. One suggestion would be to to introduce CBCS system for undergraduate programmes.




















