#### A Talk on International Taxation Laws





The International Law Society of VVM's Govind Ramnath Kare College of Law, Margao, organized a talk on International Taxation Laws at the GD Auditorium on 4th February 2025 at 10:00 am. The resource person for the talk was Prof. Victor Machekhin from Kutafin Moscow State Law University and an expert in international tax laws, tax disputes, tax consulting.

The program began with a welcome address delivered by Dr. Maria Goretti Simoes, Officiating Principal of GRKCL. Asst. Professor Sonia Shirodkar, introduced Prof. Victor and highlighted his extensive academic and professional background.

Prof. Victor began with the talk by sharing his experience of working for five years as a lawyer in the Business Unit before entering into academics. The Resource person highlighted on various issues prevalent in international taxation system and also compared the same with domestic tax system. He explained the importance of digitization in world taxation system. He emphasized that international tax liability is unavoidable for businesses operating across borders and that many tax treaties exist to manage tax obligations. He clarified that tax law is not just about mathematics but primarily about legal principles. While tax calculations are important, the legal aspects of taxation were the main focus in todays times. The resource person also highlighted about various issues associated with double taxation, various tax rules which involve the payment of tax to the government by tax payers and tax administration which involves compliance, documentation, and filings rather than direct payments to the government by tax payers.

The key topics covered under the talk was about double taxation and tax evasion by multinational corporations (MNCs). He also discussed the need for stricter international regulations to prevent and to combat tax avoidance.

The talk was followed by a prize distribution program conducted for competitons conducted by the Consumer Welfare Cell in association with the Department of Civil Supplies and Consumer Affairs, Government of Goa. Assistant Professor Ruby Luis conducted the prize distribution ceremony.

Dr. Maria Goretti Simoes, Officiating Principal of GRKCL, presented the tokens of appreciation, followed by a vote of thanks delivered by Assistant Professor Ms. Priyanka Parab, incharge of the International Law Society The event concluded at 12:30 PM, leaving students with valuable insights into international taxation laws and their growing importance in a globalized world.

Master Class on "Practical aspects of Chargesheet under the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023"





A Master Class on the topic "Practical aspects of Chargesheet under the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023" was conducted for the Fourth Year B.A.LL.B. and Third Year LL.B. Degree Students as an IQAC initiative on Wednesday, 19th February, 2025 at 10.00 am in the G.D. Auditorium by Ms. Sudiksha Naik, Police Inspector, Anti-Human Trafficking Unit, Margao.

Ms. Sudiksha Naik gave an overview of the practical aspects of preparing and submitting a chargesheet in accordance with the provisions of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023. She discussed the various stages in the preparation of the chargesheet, the challenges faced during the investigation, and the importance of meticulously drafting a chargesheet to ensure justice.

She explained the reasons why the chargesheet is a crucial document in the criminal justice system. She added that it serves as the formal accusation against an individual and lays the foundation for the trial. She said that the chargesheet has to be clear and precise, leaving no room for ambiguity, all the evidence has to be clearly outlined and supported.


She showed the students the format of the chargesheet through her Power-Point Presentation. She told the students that the chargesheet has to be filed at the earliest without any delay. She gave live instances depicting the difficulties faced while filing the chargesheet.

She concluded saying that the preparation of a chargesheet is a critical aspect of law enforcement and a well-drafted chargesheet, based on solid evidence, would help ensure that justice is served.

The session was then open for questions. The students raised a few queries which were well resolved by the Resource Person.

The talk ended with the distribution of the Participation certificates of the "Advance Certificate Course on the New Criminal Laws" held in the month of September and October.



The talk was conducted on 22nd February 2025 at 11:00 am in the G. D. Auditorium. The resource person for the talk was Dr. Vinay Madgaonkar, Assistant Professor of Marathi at Goa University. The compere for the program was Ms. Shravani Naik, F.Y.B.A.LL.B student. The Officiating Principal, Dr. Maria Goretti Simoes formally welcomed the resource person. The In-charge of Literary Society, Asst. Prof. Sonia Shirodkar, introduced the speaker.

Dr. Vinay Madgaonkar began his talk by discussing the administration of Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj, highlighting the innovative systems he implemented to govern his empire effectively. Shivaji Maharaj established a decentralized administrative structure, allowing for greater autonomy at the local level, which ensured more efficient governance. His administration was well-organized, with specific ministers overseeing critical areas such as revenue, defense, and justice. He also implemented a fair and systematic taxation policy based on the region's resources, while his military was structured to ensure strong defense both on land and at sea, with a focus on rapid responses to threats.

The judiciary under Shivaji Maharaj was another key aspect of his administration. Dr. Madgaonkar explained that Shivaji's judicial system was designed to deliver swift, fair, and accessible justice. The courts were structured with trained officers who ensured impartial rulings, and there was a clear distinction between civil and criminal cases. Punishments were meted out based on the severity of the offense, with a focus on reform in many instances, helping maintain order and peace throughout his empire.

Dr. Madgaonkar further compared Shivaji Maharaj's administration with modern management theories, particularly those of Henry Fayol and Mary Parker Follett. He drew parallels between Shivaji's principles and Fayol's concepts of division of work, authority, responsibility, and discipline, emphasizing the efficiency of his bureaucratic system. Additionally, Shivaji's leadership style was consistent with Follett's ideas of cooperation and shared leadership, where decisions were made collaboratively, ensuring a harmonious and effective system of governance.

Special Guest Lectures at India International University of Legal Education and Research

20,21, 22, 24 & 25 February

The India International University of Legal Education and Research extended invitation to G.R. Kare College of Law, Margao to attend a series of Special Guest Lectures organized by them. A team of students along with faculty members attended the following sessions:



Day 1: Thematic Discussion by Dr. V.C. Vivekanandan and Dr. Sanjeevi Shantakumar on the topic "The Interface of Law and Technology".

The thematic discussion was held on 20th February, 2025 at 2:30 pm. Six LL.M. students along with faculty members Asst. Prof. Sapresh Devidas and Asst. Prof. Parita Naik attended the discussion. Before the discussion began, the Vice Chancellor of IIULER, Prof. (Dr.) Venkata Rao introduced the guest speaker/discussants and welcomed them. In his speech he highlighted that technology developed so much that now we are witnessing the age of techno-diplomacy.

The first session was led by Dr. V.C. Vivekanandan. In his speech, he mentioned that technology and law shared a relationship similar to that of a husband and wife where the husband is going ahead and the wife tries to keep up with the pace. He discussed illusionary realism and narrated three classic stories of King Solomon and the case of two mothers quarreling over a child, Merchant of Venice, and the story of Sherlock Holmes. He placed these scenarios in the time that we live in today and explained them in a very interesting and hilarious way. The main idea was that these narratives would not work and we need to keep up with the technology. With regards to AI, he explained that this technology needs to be used wisely, or else the repercussions would be dangerous. He narrated the story of Padmasura to explain what the consequences could be when the tool becomes a master.

The second discussion was led by Dr. Sanjeevi Shantakumar. In his speech, he explained how the technology has boomed and the rapid transformation of e-commerce to q-commerce. He put forth a very crucial question: whether courts have integrated technology, whether in India we have accepted and integrated technology in all the administrative and industry setups.

He further explained how shocking it was that even after the Bhopal Gas Tragedy the nation hasn't learnt anything from it. He gave us valuable insights regarding the Bhopal Gas Tragedy and its court proceedings. The sessions concluded with a vote of thanks and a photo session with the audience.

Day 2: Guest Lecture by Prof. (Dr.) Vijay Pratap Tiwari on the topic "Judicial Review".



The guest lecture was held on 21st February, 2025 at 12:00 pm. Four students of G. R. Kare College of Law from the LL.M. program along with faculty members Asst. Prof. Harshad Bandodkar and Asst. Prof. Parita Naik attended the guest lecture.

The lecture began with a speech from the Vice Chancellor, Prof. (Dr.) Venkata Rao. Dr. Rao introduced the guest speaker and gave a warm welcoming speech. He also gave insights into the famous Madbury vs. Madison case highlighting its importance and reiterated that amending the constitution means mending it and not ending it.

The guest speaker, Prof. (Dr.) Vijay Pratap Tiwari, MNLU Nagpur, discussed in detail, along with the landmark judgments, the most important cases of judicial review in India. He also enlightened the audience about some lesser-known facts of the cases and how the Indian Judiciary has on many occasions taken inspiration from other nations while making the most crucial decisions.

The lecture ended with Dr. Yashomati Ghosh presenting the vote of thanks and a photo session with the audience.

Day 3: Guest Lecture by Prof. (Dr.) Vijay Pratap Tiwari on the topic "Medical Negligence".



On 22nd February 2025, a group of seven students namely Mohav kunkolienker, Amogh Gavas, Ignatius Praveen, Lisa Abranches, Mehvish Mulla, Bhagyashree Tavde, Santosh Shirodkar under the guidance of our faculty in charge, Asst. Prof. Shrini Fal Dessai, and Asst. Prof. Parita Naik attended a seminar on medical negligence at the India International University of Legal Education and Research (IIULER). The seminar conducted by Dr. Vijay Pratap Tiwari started at 10 am and concluded by 11:20am

Dr. Tiwari provided us with valuable insights into the complexities of medical negligence laws and elaborated on various legal aspects of medical negligence, highlighting significant case laws and ethical considerations. Day 4: Guest Lecture by Retired Justice Ravindra Chavan on the topic "Rudderless Republic Lost In The Woods Of Affirmative Action".

This guest lecture was held on 25th of February, 2025 at 9:30 am. Five Students of G. R. Kare College of Law from the LL.B. Degree Course attended this guest lectures with faculty members Asst. Prof. Priyanka Parab and Asst. Prof. Parita Naik.

The lecture began with an introductory speech by IIULER students. It was followed by a welcoming speech by Dr. Aanirbhan Chakraborty. In his lecture, the speaker, Retd. Justice Ravindra Chavan briefly highlighted the history of 'Indian Society'. The lecture concluded with a warm vote of thanks by Dr. Yashomati Ghosh.



The Role of Adhoc Judges in the High Court.





The Political Science Academium of VVM's Govind Ramnath Kare College of Law, Margao, organized a guest lecture on Thursday, February 27th at 3:30 pm, under the aegis of the Senior Advocate Manohar Usgaonkar Centre of Excellence. The topic of the lecture was "Addressing Judicial Backlog: The Role of Adhoc Judges in the High Court." The resource person for the lecture was Dr. K. Gireesan, Officer on Special Duty, Regional Centre & Head of the Department of Public Administration at the Rajiv Gandhi National Institute for Youth Development, Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, Government of India, Chandigarh. Dr. Maria Goretti Simoes, Officiating Principal, welcomed the attendees.

In his address, Dr. Gireesan began by discussing the growing challenge of judicial backlog in India, noting that the increasing number of pending cases has put immense pressure on the judicial system. He highlighted that the framers of the Constitution wisely included a provision for the appointment of adhoc judges in the judicial system.

He also pointed out that adhoc judges, by virtue of their experience and expertise, can provide valuable support to the High Courts in reducing the backlog. However, he stressed that for this system to be effective, there needs to be a more consistent and strategic use of adhoc judges, along with reforms to streamline the judicial process. Although retired judges are appointed as adhoc judges, this provision has been utilized only on a few occasions.

Dr. Gireesan further elaborated on the importance of data governance in addressing judicial backlog. He pointed out that effective management and utilization of legal data can play a pivotal role in streamlining case management processes. By implementing robust data governance practices, courts can ensure that case records are accurately tracked, deadlines are monitored, and resources are allocated efficiently. With transparent, accessible, and secure data, judicial systems can reduce inefficiencies and improve the overall speed and fairness of the legal process.

The lecture was truly thought provoking, as the resource person offered valuable insights into the topic. The program was compered by Ms. Tamanna Prajith, S.Y.B.A.LL.B. student and the vote of thanks was delivered by Asst. Prof. Ashmita Naik, In-Charge of Political Science.
