Talk on "Youth & Awareness on HIV: Aids

17th December 2025

In commemoration of World Aids Day, the Red Ribbon Club of VVM's Govind Ramnath Kare College of Law, organised an awareness session on the theme "Youth & HIV: Awareness, Action & Empowerment" on Wednesday the 17th of December, 2025 at 11:30 a.m.

Red Ribbon Club is a voluntary on-campus intervention program for students in educational institutions. It is an initiative of the State AIDS Control Society (SACS) and is supported and implemented through multi-sectoral collaboration.

The session was conducted by Dr. Annet Oliveria, who explained the basic concepts of HIV and AIDS, including how the virus spreads, preventive measures, and the importance of eliminating myths and stigma associated with the condition. She added that HIV is a silent killer and it is better to prevent the disease as there is no cure for it. She made a mention of the various reasons that could lead to HIV and she briefly spoke about the effects of HIV-Aids.



The programme concluded with the presentation of a potted plant to the resource persons for their valuable contribution. The event successfully combined informative discussions with interactive learning.

National Conference and Symposium on Mediation

26th & 27th of December 2025

Two day symposium on Mediation at IIULER, Sancoale, Goa on the 26th and 27th of December, 2025. CJI Justice Surya Kant administered the Mediation Pledge to all participants with the goal of inculcating mediation as an integral part of the Justice system. Justice Surya Kant emphasized on the philosophical aspect of mediation by stating – "we are part of one body". Mediation saves the living pulse of connections.

Adv. Norma Alvares stressed essential pillar for women to access Justice system. Mediation addresses power imbalances by creating a level playing field. Thus, it is a tool of women empowerment.

During this session, emphasis was made on the crushing mass of cases burdening our Courts. Since Justice delayed is injustice permanent, there is dire need to accelerate the disposal of cases



During the training session, Justice Purnendu Singh Justice Anshuman discussed about various utility and significance of mediation. Mediation binds the relationship and helps the parties live in a peaceful society. they also highlighted the fact that Mediation settlement can be challenged on several grounds which include fraud, corruption, persuasion and matter not fit for conciliation.

The plenary and panel discussion sessions successfully depicted various perspectives on the positive impact of mediation. The training session was particularly informative as the Mediation Act, 2023 was summarised and explained in a crisp but comprehensive manner.

Topic: Beyond the Ice: How Antarctic Change Affects Us All

VVM's G. R. Kare College of Law had the privilege of hosting a lecture under the Vidnyan Dhara Lecture Series organised by the Directorate of Higher Education on 23rd January 2026. The lecture, titled "Beyond the Ice: How Antarctic Change Affects Us All", was delivered by the distinguished resource person Dr. Cheryl A. Noronha e D Mello, Project Scientist I, National Centre for Polar and Ocean Research



During the lecture, Dr. Noronha elaborated on the impact of Antarctic changes on global sea levels, weather patterns, marine ecosystems, and biodiversity. She emphasized that climate change in polar regions directly affects coastal communities, agriculture, and human life even in countries far away from Antarctica, including India. The session also shed light on scientific research conducted in Antarctica and the urgent need for global cooperation to address climate challenges.

The programme aimed to create scientific awareness among students and faculty about climate change and its global implications, with a special focus on Antarctica.
